Toronto artist expands her gallery across the city

(Toronto, ON) Jessica Gorlicky, a local artist that has knocked the paintbrush out of the design industry for the last five years, is expanding her influence across the city this fall.

Gorlicky's work is now showing in over 20 locations, including trendy restaurants, cafés, fashion boutiques and art gallery spaces. Her own gallery, aptly named JessGo, remains at its North York location at – Finch Ave East, but it too has been refreshed with a new line of art from Gorlicky's latest collection. Gorlicky likes to call gallery JessGo her own little theme park of colour, because the walls are covered with delectable eye candy, from floor to ceiling.

Her new collection of different themed paintings are more than vibrant, mosaic-coloured portraits reflect a new stage in Gorlicky's career — one graced with spirited energy and confidence. Her portraits have had enormous success this year and were most recently chosen to decorate the Fresh fashion trade show. The signature characteristics typically seen in Gorlicky's art are still there but just like her collections from previous seasons, each painting is unique and original.

Individuality is important to Gorlicky who never fails to capture the essence of it in each of her pieces. Clients can be assured of their investment as Gorlicky will always only make one of each piece.

One of her new pieces that has garnered a lot of attention is a piece titled Labeled. It's part of a series that Gorlicky has been working on focusing on fashion, make-up and masks.

"The world's top supermodels and designers really influenced this series, just as they hand an intense influence on the fashion industry in the 80s," she said. "My art depicts that influence with incredible funk and style."

Gorlicky has become especially attached to another one of her pieces, titled So Real. It is an intense blast of serious and subtle emotion using colour as her weapon and the face as her subject, a feeling that Jessgo likes to capture in paintings and this one defiantly has it." I can't help but get lost in thought when I look at this piece. The colours and dimensions take me away to some beautiful land," she said. "I could never sell this one even though I've been offered \$3,000 for it."
